

**PENNSYLVANIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF

BY-LAWS COMMITTEE**

The By-Laws Committee of the Pennsylvania State Association of Elected County Officials ("PSAECO"), has met and has drafted the following language for consideration of the entire body. The by-laws committee makes no recommendation to the body regarding the amendment presented in this report or the underlying amendment currently on the table before the PSAECO membership.

Proposed Amendments to Pending PSAECO By-law amendment:

"A *Delegate* shall be defined as someone who is not an elected or appointed county official but is certified as a representative of a respective member association. The delegate shall have the right to state his or her association's opinion during the meetings. They may also cast a vote for their association provided that ~~at least one elected or appointed county official representing that association is present at the meeting.~~ PSAECO has received, in writing, permission from the Delegates Association authorizing the Delegate to vote in the absence of an elected or appointed official from that Association being present at any or all meetings during the calendar year."

The Amendment to the proposed by-law amendment is as follows:

"A *Delegate* shall be defined as someone who is not an elected or appointed county official but is certified as a representative of a respective member association. The delegate shall have the right to state his or her association's opinion during the meetings. ~~They~~ A Delegate may also cast a vote for ~~their~~ a Member Association provided that PSAECO has received, in writing, permission from the President of the Delegate's Member Association authorizing the Delegate to vote in the absence of a Representative elected or appointed official from the Delegate's set Member Association. PSAECO must receive notice of the Delegate's authorization to vote on behalf of the Delegate's Member Association before the commencement of the meeting at which the Delegate is to have voting authority. The authority will expire at the end of the meeting for which the authority was granted, but may be renewed for a subsequent meeting being present at any or all meetings during the calendar year."
